As we continue to navigate our way through this lockdown, I hope this latest newsletter is finding you all safe and well. We are all hoping we can enter lower lockdown levels soon and are eagerly awaiting Monday's update to see how far away from this we are. Our thoughts and well wishes go out to the parts of the country that are going through a more uncertain and potentially longer lockdown experience.

A big thank you for taking the lockdown seriously and doing what we all have been asked to do - we've seen before that staying at home will break the chain of transmission and save lives. It is even more important that we all follow the health advice because the Delta variant is very contagious.

I wanted to reassure you that our school staff and Board will continue to be available to support your child's learning and wellbeing in the coming days. As the Mental Health Foundation of NZ says, "It's all right to feel a range of emotions right now. Going into a Level 4 lockdown is a big deal and it brings all sorts of different feelings to the surface, including frustration, worry and even gratitude. A huge thank you to all the staff who have been instrumental in supporting the smooth transition to remote learning. Staff continue to provide online meetings (zoom) to give students a chance to make contact with their teacher, and to also connect with their peers in a safe manner.

A small group of staff will be working hard on Monday to organise and distribute other remote learning supports to those that asked for them. We will get these to you as soon as possible. This will be a contactless drop off.


