### Walking Time Zone Map

The tamariki at Bathaate Park School have been busy on a Walking Time Zone Mapping project with the aim to encourage more children to walk to/from school. to help reduce congestion at the school gate. Tamariki, from Tāwhaki in 2022, walked different routes from school and recorded 5. 10 and 15 minute zones. To help identify the distances from the school stickers are on the footpaths which show how far away the school is from that point. These



points have been placed into zones on a map.


